Wallington County Grammar School School Uniform

Wallington County Grammar School requires students to wear school uniform. We believe that a school uniform provides a sense of belonging and identity whilst setting an appropriate tone for an education setting.

Details of our school uniform requirements can be found below:

Compulsory items for Years Y7-11

Only available at Cladish & Co, Woodcote Road, Wallington:

- School blazer £37.99 - £42.99
- School tie £7.99

Widely Available:

- Charcoal grey trousers (not black)
- White shirt (when worn must be tucked into trousers and top button done up)
- Dark grey / black Socks
- Black polished shoes (no boots)
- School bag

- Navy blue shorts
- Navy blue rugby/football socks
- White trainers (non-marking soles) suitable for indoor use only
- Dark trainers suitable for outdoor use only
- Rugby boots (low cut acceptable) for outside use only and must have legal metal studs or blades rather than football studs – which are not allowed when playing rugby for safety reasons
- White trainer socks
